Smokey Robinson and Michael Bolton were the featured artists at the previous two benefit concerts.

Michael McDonald's voice made classics of songs such as *Takin'* to the Streets, It Keeps You Runnin', Minute By Minute, Sweet Freedom, On My Own with Patti Labelle and the Grammy-award winning Ya Mo B There with James Ingram. His 2005 Christmas album, Through The Many Winters, sold 500,000 copies in two weeks.

McDonald's vocal style and mastery of the keyboard have been utilized to sing and play with other notable artists such as Ray Charles, Aretha Franklin, Elton John and Joni Mitchell.

In addition to his outstanding musical talents, **Michael McDonald** is an active humanitarian. His causes include MusiCares, the National Council of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse and the 7UP Grammy Signature Schools Program. He was part of a star-studded lineup at Kokua for Japan, which raised \$1.6 million for tsunami relief.

The Alabama Shakespeare Festival is the State Theatre of Alabama. In addition to producing the highest level of professional theatre, ASF offers **SchoolFest**, the student-matinee program that exposes more than 40,000 students annually to the theatrical arts and literacy projects. The theatre also conducts multiple camps, including **Camp Shakespeare**, and classes for children throughout the year. ASF's **Southern Writers' Project Festival of Plays** focuses on the creation of new Southern-themed works, many of which have gone on to be published or produced at ASF and around the country.

To keep tickets affordable, over half of ASF's \$7.6 million budget must come from contributions and special events such as Benefit the Bard fundraiser. The last two **Benefit the Bard** fundraisers raised over \$300,000 each.

ASF has approximately a \$20 million impact on the River Region and is responsible for the creation of about 1,000 jobs. It is an economic closer attracting executives and industry to Alabama. As a nationally renowned theatre producer, ASF continues to enhance the reputation of the State of Alabama and the region.

The Alabama Shakespeare Festival is among the largest Shakespeare Theatres in the world. Designated as the State Theatre of Alabama, ASF has been located in Montgomery since 1985 when it moved from Anniston as a result of Mr. and Mrs. Wynton Blount's gift of a performing arts complex in the 250-acre Wynton M. Blount Cultural Park.
